Leave Rules and Absence Fine

1. Student shall apply for leave whenever needed on the prescribed form obtainable from the college office. Leave application also has to be counter signed by the parents of the student.
2. Student must submit her application herself before availing leave and not after absenting herself from the college except in sickness case in which the application must be submitted on the date when the student attends the college after recovery along with medical certificate.
3. Leave upto 3 days can be granted by the tutor or any teacher teaching her class and upto 7 days by the Faculty head/Senior most teacher and more than 7 days by the Vice-Principal on the recommendation of the tutor / Head of the faculty.
4. **Under University Rules if a student remains absent from the classes for 15 days or 50% of classes in a month or for 6 days continuously without leave or medical, her name shall be struck off from the college rolls irrespective of the fact that she had paid her dues. Only once the defaulter can be re-admitted as per university norms with the readmission fee of Rs. 500/-.**
5. Absence without leave will be fined Rs. 5/- for each period, absence in monthly mentor's tutorial will be fined Rs. 50/- per tutorial, absent in class test will be fined Rs. 100/- per paper.
6. **Leave does not mean condonation of attendance. Student has to complete 75% attendance excluding leaves.**

CAREER-ORIENTED-ADD-ON-COURSES

As per U.G.C. scheme to link education with career the college has started the following 10 Add-on Courses. The objective of this scheme is to introduce career and market-oriented skill enhancing add-on-courses that have utility for job, self employment and empowerment of the students. At the end of three years, the students will be equipped with the certificate along with a conventional degree in Science/Arts/Commerce. There are 30 seats in each course.

Eligibility for Admission

Any bonafide student of this college studying in Under Graduate Course (B.A., B.Com., B.Sc., BCA) or Post Graduate Course is eligible to opt any of these Add-on-Courses. These career oriented Add-On Courses are of **CERTIFICATE LEVEL** (One year duration), **DIPLOMA LEVEL** (Two year duration) & **ADVANCE DIPLOMA** (Three year duration). Any student of under graduate and post graduate class can join certificate level course. The student passing certificate course can join Diploma course in relevant subject & the student passing Diploma course can join Advance Diploma course in relevant subject. Students also have liberty to pursue for three different certificate courses in three years or one certificate & one diploma course. Assessment & Exam. will be of 150 marks - Theory, Project & Practical of 50 marks each.

REFUND OF SECURITIES

CONDITIONS FOR APPEARING IN UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION
Class Tests / Sessionals and submission of assignments will be strictly held according to KUK rules.

Conditions for Appearing in Semester Examination

Only such students will be permitted to appear in the University Examination who fulfill the conditions specified under Special Regulations as follows :-

- a) **Class Test** :- A student shall not be eligible to appear in the University Examination unless she appears & pass the class tests.
- b) **Two assignments** : Students are required to submit two assignments per subject in each semester in addition to Class Tests.
- c) **75% Attendance** : A student shall not be eligible to appear in the University Examination unless she has attended at least 75% of the full course of lectures delivered to her class in each of the subjects.
- d) Students absenting themselves from the Class Tests/Sessionals without leave shall be fined at the rate of Rs.100/- per paper as it is compulsory for all the students to take the Class Tests and students not submitting the assignments in time will also be fined.

STUDENTS SUPPORT & FACILITIES

Grant of Fee Concessions, Books, Scholarships and Stipends

Fee concessions, books and scholarships are granted to poor, brilliant students, good sportspersons and holders of distinctions in co-curricular activities. Government, University, UGC, Private (By trusts & Individual) and all other scholarships like State and National Merit scholarships, scholarships for SC/BC and scholarships for the wards of serving employees of college are also available in the college.

All concessions & scholarships are subject to good behaviour, satisfactory academic results and regularity in attendance. These scholarships/concessions may be withdrawn at any time —

- (a) If it is found that the recipient has ceased to deserve it on account of some lapses on her part.
- (b) If the student does not appear or fails in class Test or sessionals.
- (c) Only one benefit of scholarship & concession will be awarded to a student at one time.

N.C.C. was started in the college in 2008. A platoon of SW has been allotted to college by 1 Har Girls Bn NCC, Ambala Cantt. Only 53 students will be enrolled as NCC Cadets. The students who want to specialise and train themselves for career in Armed forces and paramilitary forces will be greatly benefitted by NCC as 'C' certificate holders are exempted from written test and get direct entry in forces through interview only, otherwise 5 to 10 additional marks are given while deciding meritlists everywhere in admissions and jobs. N.C.C. also develops the qualities of leadership, courage, patriotism and gives an edge to the personality.

Shakti Manch - The Women Cell

Women cell has been established in the college as 'Shakti Manch' under Women National Policy of Education. Its aim is to empower women in their struggle for equality and for an effective presence in society. This cell organises various talks & competitions to make students aware of women's rights and responsibilities.

Jagriti Manch - The Legal Literacy Cell & Equal Opportunity Centre

Jagriti Manch organises lectures for legal literacy of students about human rights, rights of women and consumer rights etc. This manch also organise lectures and short term courses with test on positive discrimination.

Red Ribbon Club

To spread awareness about HIV/AIDS and safe transfusion of blood the college has formed a Red Ribbon Club under Haryana AIDS control society. The purpose of this club is to prepare youth as peer educators and agents of change by developing their skills on leadership and team building. and educate the people about Aids & safe access to safe Blood through these students.

Rotaract Club

College got charter of Rotaract Club with the name of Rotaract Club, Arya Kanya Mahavidyalya with the consent of Rotary Club, Shahabad Markanda. Rotaractor students of college work as an NGO for the welfare of society and help of the needy people and thus develop a special core of their personality.

The Swayam-Mooc Cell

The Swayam-Mooc Cell, AKMV, Shahabad was formed in December 2019-20 as per the guidelines of Government of India. The objective of this cell is to create awareness among students for 'Massive Open Online Courses' that are offered to students of Indian Universities and Colleges by Government of India

through SWAYAM-ARPIT platform. The cell is quite active and has arranged webinars, workshops and extension lectures for both teachers and students since its inception.

Aatamnirbhar Bharat Cell

Self-employment is going to be the key to achieve Aatamnirbhar and skills need to be imparted among students through the higher education institutions of the Haryana state because youths have an important role in moving forward towards the achievement of goal of 'Aatamnirbhar Bharat'. To achieve the proposed objective of the Aatamnirbhar Bharat, Haryana state Higher Education Council, Haryana, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and Swadeshi Swablaban Nyas jointly directed to form Aatamnirbhar Bharat Cell which was constructed by Arya Kanya Mahavidyalya in 2020-21.

Swami Vivekanand Youth Cell

On the occasion of 158th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, Arya Kanya Mahavidyalya formed "Swami Vivekananda Youth Cell" in 2020-21 with the aim of channelizing our student's energy to work for the upliftment of our society. The cell aims to fully utilize the potential & capabilities of college students by making them more self-confident, brave and develop a spirit of voluntarism in social activities. The cell shall work to raise awareness in the community regarding various social issues. This cell focuses on various social activities like school in slums, youth journalism, conduct community surveys, environment and health awareness campaigns, one-on-one interaction with rural households etc.

Anti Tobacco Cell

Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Club was constituted in the session 2019-20 under the guidelines of MHRD, Govt. of India. The motto of this club is cultural exchange between states to strengthen National Integration. Under this campaign Haryana is paired with Telangana. Every month of the year, EBSB Day is celebrated by organising Literary, Social, Cultural Programs, Awareness Campaign, Community Service and Learning the language of paired state etc. Fifty students are the members of this club.

VOTER CARD

Students are required to get their Voter Cards made soon after turning 18 yrs. of age. A photocopy of Voter Card should be attached with the admission form.

AADHAR CARD

Students are required to get their 'Aadhar Cards' made. They will be needed for depositing scholarships etc. Attach photocopy.

Associations & Societies

There are associations, societies & clubs to encourage the students to take part in various activities and competitions like Drama, Dance, Quiz, Power Point Presentation, Poster Making, Slogan Writing, Painting, Rangoli, Flower Decoration, Paper Reading, Shlokocharan, Debate, Declamation, Poetic Recitation, Music, Tours, Social Service Projects, Sports, Blood Donation etc.

College Magazine

The college magazine '**NEELJA**' provides an opportunity to the students having a flair for writing. The students are encouraged to contribute articles to the magazine in English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Panjabi. Each section has a student editor working under the teacher editor. Students learn the art of writing under the guidance of Editorial Board.

Alumni Association

To maintain the strong emotional bonds with its old students Alumni Association has been formed. Old students meet is held in the campus every year with the name - 'Smritiyan'. We wish that they attend the function to refresh their memories and wish their Alma-matter good luck & progress. We also expect that they contribute to the progress of college through their suggestions, scholarships to needy and maritorious students and also help in their placements.

Healthy Practices

Adhyatmic Sabha :

The aim of Adhyatmic Sabha is to inculcate spiritual and cultural values in the minds of the students. The college organises the Havan on every special occasion and Prayer on every Monday. It also celebrates the National festivals by organising different activities.

Student Central Association

There is a student central association to co-ordinate and integrate the various clubs and associations, to ensure the maintenance of proper academic atmosphere, discipline in the college and organisation of various functions by the college.

Monthly Mentorship Tutorials

The college is having the healthy tradition of holding regular mentorship tutorials for all round personality development of students and for better interaction between the teacher and taught. Every teacher acts in as mentor is entrusted with the assignment of interacting with a group of 50 students.

Healthcare of Students

The college provides medical facility to students. A renowned M.B.B.S. Doctor Ms. Manisha visits the college every Saturday at 9.30 a.m. to solve the problems relating to health of the students and staff. College also provides free medicines for general health problems. Series of talks is also organised for students to make them aware of different health issues.

Prizes & Awards

Prizes and Awards are awarded at the Annual Prize Distribution Function for top positions and distinctions won in University Examinations and remarkable achievements in Sports, Athletics, N.S.S., N.C.C. and Youth Welfare Activities to encourage the students. Special prizes & certificates of Excellence are granted to the All round best student and student who prove themselves best in Academics, Dance, Acting, Singing, Speech, Poem Recitation, Sanskrit Declamation / Shlokacharan, Fine Arts Activities, Home Sc. Activities, Best Library user and Hosteller etc.

Code of Conduct for Students

1. All the students should get their Identity Cards made from the College Library after their admission. It Should be signed by the Principal. Students must wear their Identity Cards during their stay in the college. It is the duty of a student to show her Identity Card if demanded by the Principal or any other lecturer/authority of the college. It should not be passed on to other students. In case of loss/damage/theft, a New Identity Card will be reissued to a student only on a payment of Rs. 100/- with the special permission of the Principal.
2. Students must read the notice board before leaving the college to get information about instructions/orders issued by the Principal from time to time.
3. Student must remain in discipline and it is their moral duty to show respect towards their teachers and elders.
4. Students are advised not to roam around in the varandahs or outside the classrooms under any circumstances so as to avoid disturbance in teaching. Misuse of Mobile Phones in the college campus is strictly prohibited. A fine of Rs. 500/- will be imposed on violation of this rule.
5. If any student is found violating any of the code of conduct or any other instructions displayed on notice board from time to time, the Principal will have the right to suspend/terminate the student from the college.
6. The girls should come to the college in dignified and proper dress.
7. Smoking and use of drugs in the college campus is a punishable offence.
8. Student are expected to protect college property and maintain the beauty of the campus by their appropriate actions.
9. Students are also advised not to sit on staircases to avoid inconvenience to others.
10. Not student should take part in any strike or provoke any other student to go on strike or any illegal activity whatsoever. Violation of this rule may attract stringent punishment.
11. If the teacher is on leave the students should to quietly to library and study books, newspapers/ periodicals.
12. Calling out any student from the class is undesirable and will be considered as an act of gross indiscipline. Parents must contact the office to call their wards from the class after explaining the

emergency, involved. In such a case the student will be called by the office and allowed to meet the parents/guardians.

13. Students are not allowed to bring/invite outsiders in the college premises.
14. It is mandatory for all the students to be present in the college functions, failing in which will lead to the imposition of fine on them.

Anti-Ragging Measures

Arya Kanya Mahavidyalya, Shahabad Markanda is a No Ragging & No Smoking zone.

Ragging in educational institutions is banned. Any one indulging in ragging will be punished appropriately which may include expulsion from the college, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

The following will be considered as acts of ragging :

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing generating a sense or shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student. There have been no cases of ragging in the college. However, students should immediately contact the Principal in the event of ragging by senior students.

Note :

In this regard candidate and his/her parents has to furnish an undertaking/affidavit duly signed giving along with admission form.

Policy for Disabled Persons

To create a disabled friendly, and barrier free environment, Arya Kanya Mahavidyalya, Shahabad Markanda is determined to provide/create :

छात्राओं तथा उनके अभिभावकों के ध्यानार्थ प्रमुख नियम

1. न्यूनतम उपस्थिति

- ★ प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी के लिए प्रत्येक विषय की कुल उपस्थितियों में से 75 प्रतिशत उपस्थितियां अनिवार्य हैं अन्यथा वह विश्वविद्यालय की वार्षिक परीक्षा के लिए अयोग्य समझा जाएगा। अतः उसे विश्वविद्यालय का रोल नं० जारी नहीं किया जाएगा।
- ★ किसी एक या एक से अधिक विषयों में छः दिन लगातार या एक महीने में 15 दिन अनुपस्थित होने पर छात्रा का नाम महाविद्यालय से काट दिया जाएगा। प्राचार्या की अनुमति मिलने पर तथा 500/- रू. पुनः प्रवेश शुल्क जमा करवाने पर ही पुनः प्रवेश प्राप्त हो सकता है। पुनः प्रवेश केवल एक बार हो सकता है।

2. अवकाश

- ★ छात्रा निर्धारित फार्म पर ही छुट्टी का प्रार्थना पत्र दे सकती है। यह फार्म महाविद्यालय-कार्यालय से नकद भुगतान कर प्राप्त किया जा सकता है। अस्वस्थता (Medical) के अतिरिक्त अन्य सभी दशाओं में अवकाश आवेदन पत्र पहले जमा कराया जाना आवश्यक है। माता-पिता/ अभिभावक के हस्ताक्षर करवाना आवश्यक है। तीन दिन तक के अवकाश के प्रार्थना पत्र पर ट्यूटर अथवा कक्षा के किसी भी प्राध्यापिका के, 4 से 7 दिन तक के अवकाश के लिए विभागाध्यक्ष अथवा वरिष्ठ प्राध्यापिका के तथा सात से अधिक दिनों के अवकाश हेतु उप-प्राचार्या के हस्ताक्षर अनिवार्य हैं। अस्वस्थता-अवकाश (Sick Leave) के लिए डॉक्टर के प्रमाणपत्र सहित छुट्टी का प्रार्थना पत्र महाविद्यालय में लौटने पर तुरन्त जमा करा दिया जाना चाहिए।
- ★ ध्यान रखें कि अवकाश लेने पर अनुपस्थिति का जुर्माना नहीं लिया जाएगा, किन्तु इस अवकाश काल को उपस्थितियों की गणना में शामिल नहीं किया जाएगा। अतएव अवकाश के आधार पर न्यूनतम उपस्थिति तथा आंतरिक-मूल्यांकन (Internal Assessment) के अंकों में उपस्थिति का हितलाभ प्राप्त नहीं किया जा सकता। बिना प्रार्थना पत्र दिए अनुपस्थित रहने पर 5/- रुपये प्रति कक्षा जुर्माना होगा।

3. विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा के लिए अनिवार्य योग्यता एवं आंतरिक कक्षा परीक्षाएं

- ★ प्रत्येक विद्यार्थी द्वारा आंतरिक-कक्षा परीक्षा देना और उसमें उत्तीर्ण होना अनिवार्य है, उक्त के अतिरिक्त दो हस्तलिखित Assignments प्रत्येक सैमेस्टर में प्रत्येक विषय में जमा करानी होगी। अन्यथा उसे विश्वविद्यालय की परीक्षा हेतु अयोग्य समझा जाएगा एवं रोल नं० जारी नहीं किया जाएगा।
- ★ महाविद्यालय में विषम सत्र (पहला, तृतीय, पांचवा) की आंतरिक परीक्षा सितम्बर/अक्टूबर में तथा सम सत्र (द्वितीय, चतुर्थ, षष्ठ) की आंतरिक परीक्षा मार्च/अप्रैल में ली जाएगी।

4. आंतरिक मूल्यांकन

प्रत्येक विषय (theory only) के आंतरिक मूल्यांकन (Internal Assessment) के 20 अंकों में से 4 अंक उपस्थितियों के आधार पर तथा 6 अंक आंतरिक परीक्षाओं के आधार पर भेजे जाएंगे। 10 अंकों का आंतरिक मूल्यांकन Assignments के आधार पर होगा, जो दो प्रति विषय प्रति सैमेस्टर जमा करवानी अनिवार्य है।

5. प्रार्थना सभा :-

प्रत्येक सोमवार को पहले तीन कालांशों (पीरियड) के बाद प्रार्थना सभा आयोजित की जाएगी। जिसमें सभी छात्राओं का श्रद्धापूर्वक भाग लेना अनिवार्य होगा।

6. पहचान पत्र (Identity Card)

प्रतिदिन अपने साथ पहचान-पत्र लाना अनिवार्य है। पहचान पत्र के बिना महाविद्यालय प्रांगण तथा कक्षा में प्रवेश की अनुमति नहीं होगी। पहचान पत्र गुम हो जाने पर 100/- रुपये की राशि महाविद्यालय पुस्तकालय में जमा करवाने पर पहचान-पत्र की दोहरी प्रति बनवाई जा सकती है।

7. फीस भुगतान

विद्यार्थी को फीस तथा अन्य निर्धारित शुल्क निश्चित समय पर जमा करवाने होंगे अन्यथा बकाया राशि विलम्ब शुल्क सहित वसूली जाएगी। निर्धारित शुल्क पूर्ण रूप से जमा न करवाने पर विश्वविद्यालय परीक्षा हेतु रोल नं. जारी नहीं किया जाएगा।

8. पुस्तकालय सेवा का उपयोग :-

- ★ विद्यार्थी पुस्तकालय-कार्ड पर 14 दिन हेतु पुस्तकें निर्गमित (issue) करा सकते हैं। इस अवधि के बाद प्रत्येक निर्गमित पुस्तक पर तीन रुपये प्रतिदिन के हिसाब से विलम्ब शुल्क देना होगा।
- ★ पुस्तकालय कार्ड गुम हो जाने पर 100/- रुपये जमा करवाने पर पुस्तकालय कार्ड की दोहरी प्रति बनवाई जा सकती है।
- ★ पुस्तकालय की पत्र-पत्रिकाओं तथा पुस्तकों पर कुछ भी लिखना, निशान लगाना तथा पृष्ठ फाड़ना सख्त मना है।
- ★ पुस्तकालय में अनौपचारिक वार्तालाप पूर्णतया प्रतिबंधित है।
- ★ खुली पुस्तकालय व्यवस्था (ओपन शैल्फ सिस्टम) के अंतर्गत अलमारियों से निकाली गई पुस्तकों को देखने व पढ़ने के पश्चात् उन्हें अलमारियों में स्वयं न रख कर निकटतम मेज पर ही रहने दें।
- ★ पुस्तकालय का अधिकाधिक सदुपयोग करें।
- ★ पुस्तकालय में किसी प्रकार के खाद्य व पेय पदार्थ का सेवन वर्जित है।
- ★ अपनी पुस्तक पढ़ने के लिए पुस्तकालय में नवनिर्मित अध्ययन कक्ष में ही बैठें। पुस्तकालय की पुस्तक लेने की आवश्यकता होने पर ही पुस्तकालय में प्रवेश करें।
- ★ पुस्तकालय में प्रवेश करते ही उपस्थिति रजिस्टर पर हस्ताक्षर अवश्य करें, इसी आधार पर Best Library User का पुरस्कार प्रदान किया जाएगा।

9. महाविद्यालय छोड़ने का प्रावधान

- ★ विषम सत्र के आरम्भ में महाविद्यालय छोड़ कर जाने वाले विद्यार्थियों के लिए रजिस्टर से नाम कटवाना जरूरी है। ऐसा न करने पर उन्हें पूरी फीस देनी पड़ेगी। महाविद्यालय छोड़ने पर जमा कराए गए मूल प्रमाणपत्र यथाशीघ्र, किन्तु अधिक से अधिक छह मास में वापिस ले लिए जाने चाहिए। इस समय के बाद महाविद्यालय उत्तरदायी नहीं होगा।

★ सत्र के बीच महाविद्यालय छोड़ने पर सिक्कूरिटी के अतिरिक्त कोई भी राशि वापिस नहीं की जाएगी।

10. प्रतिभूति (सिक्कूरिटी) की वापसी

★ पिछले सत्र की प्रतिभूति मार्च मास की 15 से 30 तारीख तक वापिस ली जा सकती है। ध्यान रहे, इनमें से किसी भी तारीख को सार्वजनिक अवकाश होने पर महाविद्यालय का कार्यालय बन्द रहेगा। दिनांक 30 मार्च तक प्रतिभूति वापिस न लिए जाने पर वह जब्त कर ली जाएगी।

★ प्रतिभूति की वापसी के लिए विद्यार्थी को स्वयं प्रत्यक्ष रूप से महाविद्यालय के कार्यालय में उपस्थित होना पड़ेगा। किसी प्रकार के 'अधिकार-पत्र' से नियुक्त किसी प्रतिनिधि को प्रतिभूति की राशि का भुगतान नहीं किया जाएगा और न ही इसकी अदायगी मनीआर्डर/बैंक ड्राफ्ट इत्यादि के माध्यम से की जाएगी।

11. सूचना पट (नोटिस बोर्ड)

★ प्रतिदिन सूचना-पट अवश्य पढ़िए। आपकी जानकारी के लिए महाविद्यालय की विभिन्न गतिविधियों, योजनाओं, समारोहों और समाचारों की सूचनाएं, सूचना-पट पर लगा दी जाती हैं। सूचनाएं न पढ़ने की स्थिति में आप महत्वपूर्ण स्वर्णिम अवसरों का लाभ उठाने से वंचित रह सकते हैं। सूचना-पट न पढ़ने के कारण, सूचना न मिलने के आधार पर विद्यार्थी को होने वाली हानि व परेशानी हेतु महाविद्यालय प्रशासन उत्तरदायी नहीं होगा।

12. पाठ्य व लेखन सामग्री

★ कापी, पेन तथा प्राध्यापकों द्वारा अनुमोदित व निर्धारित पाठ्य पुस्तकें कक्षा में लाना आवश्यक है। इन के बिना कक्षा-कक्ष में जाने पर विद्यार्थियों के विरुद्ध अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही हो सकती है।

13. दूरभाष का उपयोग

★ महाविद्यालय परिसर में चल-दूरभाष (मोबाइल फोन) का प्रयोग करना पूर्णतया वर्जित है। महाविद्यालय में मोबाइल फोन इस्तेमाल करने पर 1000/- रुपये का जुर्माना होगा। नितांत आवश्यक होने पर कार्यालय में नकद भुगतान कर सार्वजनिक दूरभाष सेवा का उपयोग कर सकते हैं।

14. छात्रवृत्तियाँ

★ विश्वविद्यालय, हरियाणा सरकार एवं अन्य संस्थाओं द्वारा जारी किए जाने वाली छात्रवृत्तियों की सूचना यथासमय सूचना पट पर उपलब्ध करवाई जाएंगी।

★ अनुसूचित तथा पिछड़ी जाति की छात्राओं को सरकारी छात्रवृत्ति के फार्म समयानुसार भरना अनिवार्य है। अतः वे कार्यालय में अवश्य सम्पर्क करें।

★ अन्य जरूरतमंद छात्राएं प्रवेश के साथ ही आय प्रमाण-पत्र एवं अंक सूचियों के साथ प्रार्थना-पत्र कार्यालय में जमा करवाएं।

25. अपनी किसी भी स्वास्थ्य समस्या के लिए प्रत्येक शनिवार महाविद्यालय के महिला प्रकोष्ठ में डॉ. जनक अरोड़ा से बात करें।
26. Mentor ट्यूटोरियल में अवश्य जाएं तथा Group Discussion में खुलकर भाग लें। अपने Mentor teacher से अपनी समस्याएं भी सांझा कर सलाह ले सकती हैं।
